This is My Care Corp Story



After volunteering at Care Corp for six years I was asked to tell my story. Our lives were changed forever on May 13th 2005 due to a horrific fire that destroyed our home. I was baking a cake after cooking lunch and had lost track of time and noticed it was time to go get my two girls from school. My husband and I went to pick them up as we were waiting in the parking lot, the police, fire and rescue drove by us. "I said that's strange wonder what happened". We soon returned home to find our house completely in gulfed in flames. I was in shock wondering what had happened, and thankful at the same time that we were not home. That day seemed to go on forever.

It is difficult to look back, but grateful for our new lives to begin. I owe a lot of this to Care Corp for their help in starting over. They have been very supportive, they have taught me the skills that I needed to move forward again, and that people really do care. They have taught me many job skills from volunteering. I was a stay at home mom and was ready to go out into the work world. Volunteering at Care Corps I answer phones, take messages, and make food boxes. I do intakes for new clients coming into Care Corp. I also, do background checks, fax, file, and stock shelves with donations.

Care Corp has been very kind to me over the years, since then our family has made a new home and have rebuilt our lives. We have made life long changes in our lives, which I thought could never happen. We have completed all counseling, and parenting classes, all that was needed to move forward. There are other organizations that helped along the way. Like the Salvation Army, Red Cross, and Low Income Ministry. The helpful staff and volunteers I have met along the way have been great. I appreciate everything they have done for us all.
